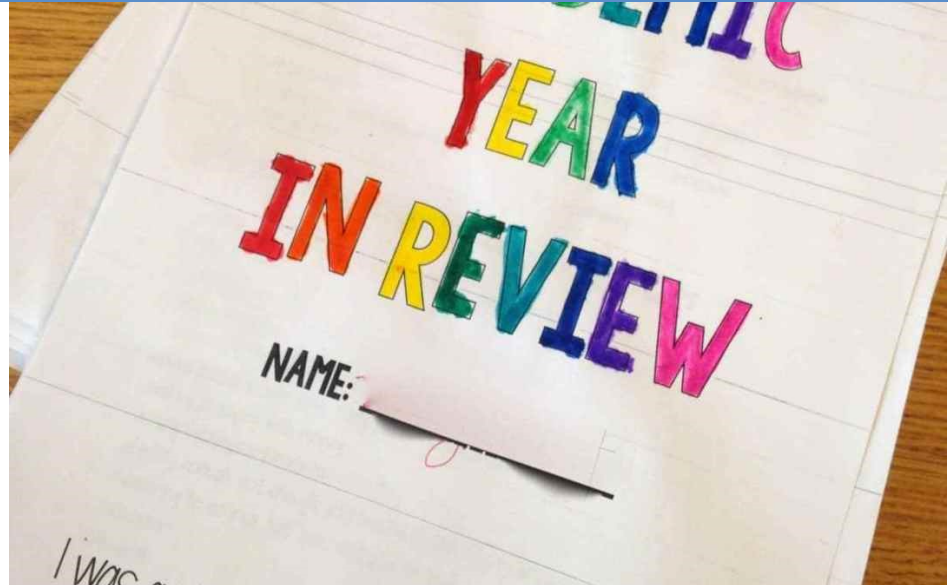

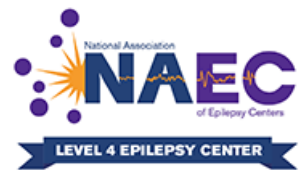
Nicklaus Children’s Hospital Accredited by NAEC as Level IV Epilepsy Center

Here are the steps to become a medical doctor

The question “What do you want to be when you grow up?” gives way to endless options and possibilities. A firefighter. A pilot. An artist. A doctor.

While it’s lovely to envision one’s future profession, the path to actually becoming, say, a doctor, requires certain specific steps.

“The path to becoming a doctor is a long, yet rewarding one,” says the South Miami resident, who

graduated from the Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine at Florida International University. “This is a brief roadmap for aspiring physicians.”

Step 1: Earn a Bachelor’s Degree. There is no specific college major required for acceptance to medical school. You must, however, complete the core “pre-med” prerequisite credits in Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics and English. Aside from academics, seek opportunities for community service and leadership, spend time working with healthcare professionals and get involved in research projects, as these experiences will enrich your medical school application. Build relationships with mentors who can provide career guidance and can write letters of recommendation.

Step 3: Earn a medical degree (M.D. or D.O.). Medical school is a four-year course of study. The first two years are traditionally more classroom-based, whereas the third and fourth years are spent rotating through different hospital and clinic settings. During medical school, students take the United States Medical Licensing Exams (USMLE) Step 1 and 2. CK multiple-choice tests, as well as USMLE Step 2 CS, which involves live, simulated patient scenarios. Fourth year medical students must again go through the process of applications and interviews in order to get into residency.

Step 4: Residency. Each specialty (Internal Medicine, Pediatrics, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Surgery, etc.) requires residency training. Residency programs are three to five years long, depending on the specialty. Residents must take the USMLE Step 3 or COMLEX-USA and obtain state licensure. They may also take an additional exam to become board-certified. (Puerto completed three years of pediatric residency

of Florida for her undergraduate degree.)

Step 2: Take the MCAT and apply to medical school. The application to medical school has two parts, the “primary” and “secondary” applications. The primary medical school application will include your Medical College Admission Test (MCAT) score, college transcript, résumé, letters of recommendation and a personal statement essay. The admissions committee will review your primary application.

If you meet their criteria, they will request a secondary application with an additional list of essay questions. Once the committee reviews the secondary applications, qualified applicants are invited to an on-campus interview and later selected to become part of the incoming medical school class.
